After School Safety

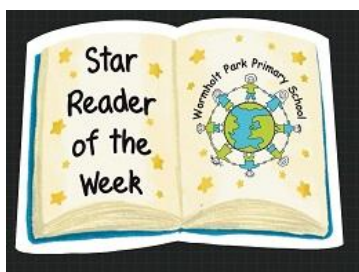

Grammar and punctuation you should include:

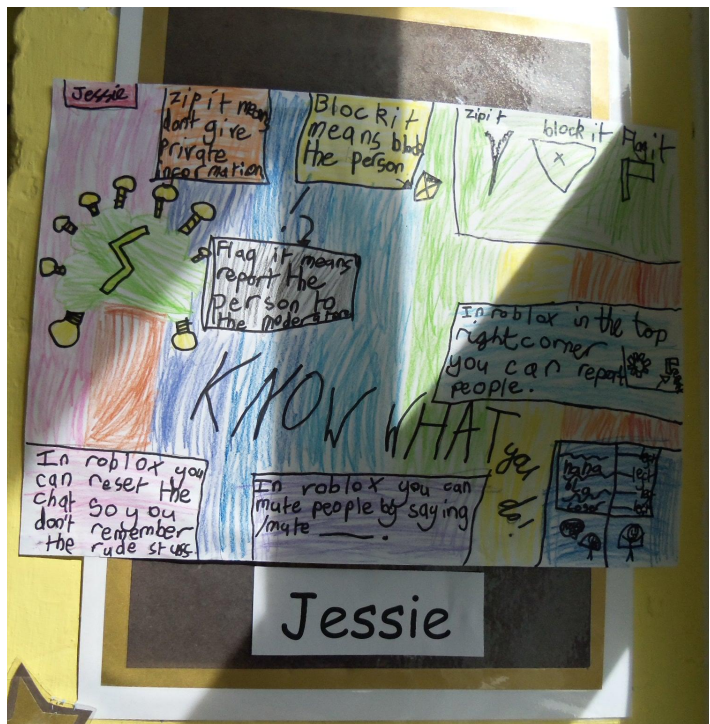
- ✓ adjectives

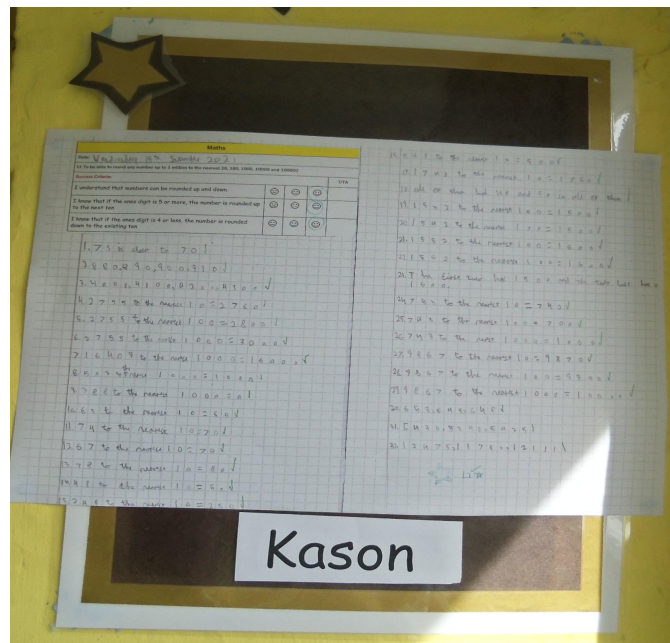
Dear Diary,
