What stood out to me was that she very quickly picked up on the positive relationships between staff and children. In all the sessions she observed, she also talked about how well behaved and respectful the children were.

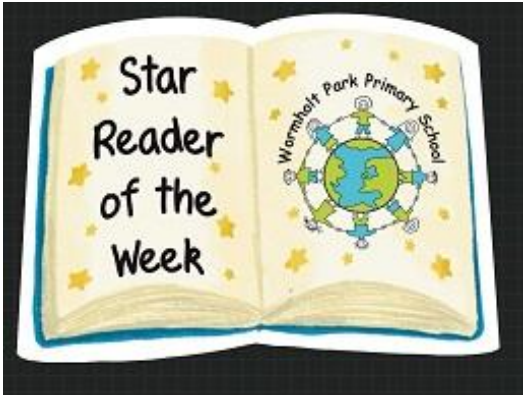
She feels that we are in a really good place with our reading and that we just need to make a few tweaks. She talked a lot about how important it is for teachers and parents/carers/older siblings to read stories to the children. Through reading stories, we can expose the children to words they might not already know, which increases their vocabulary. We can also help them to develop their comprehension skills and prediction skills. Most importantly, we can help the children to develop a lifelong love for reading. We will be holding a workshop after half term to support parents in the best ways to read stories to their children.

Another thing that Pam was really impressed with, was how tidy and clean the school was and how the school grounds look so well maintained. We are very lucky to have Patrick and Adewale, who work really hard to keep our school site so beautiful!

We have had a few positive cases of Covid in the school. You will have received an email if there has been a case in your child's year. 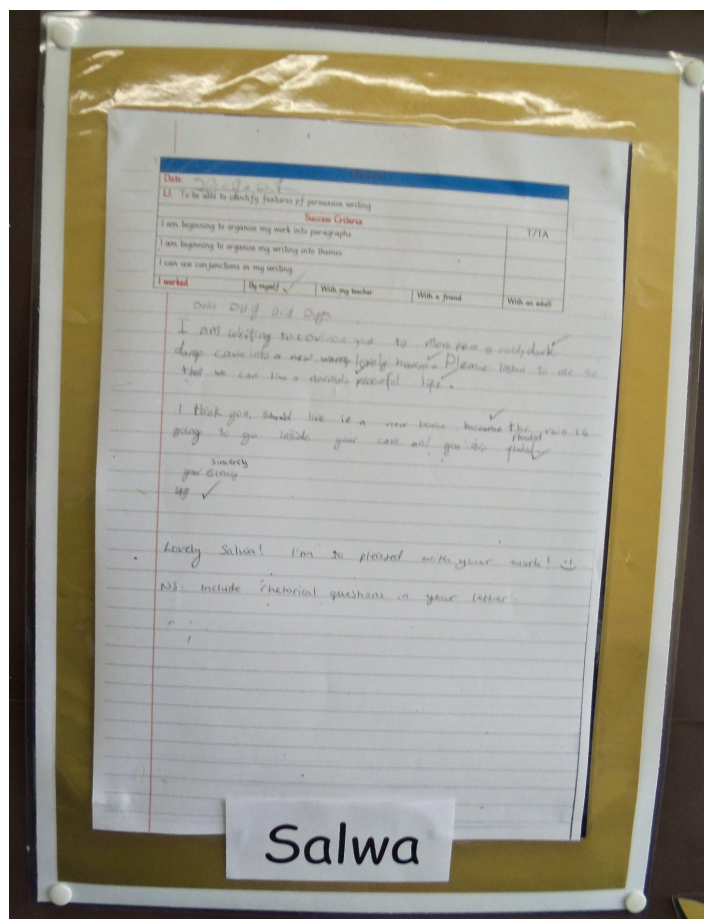
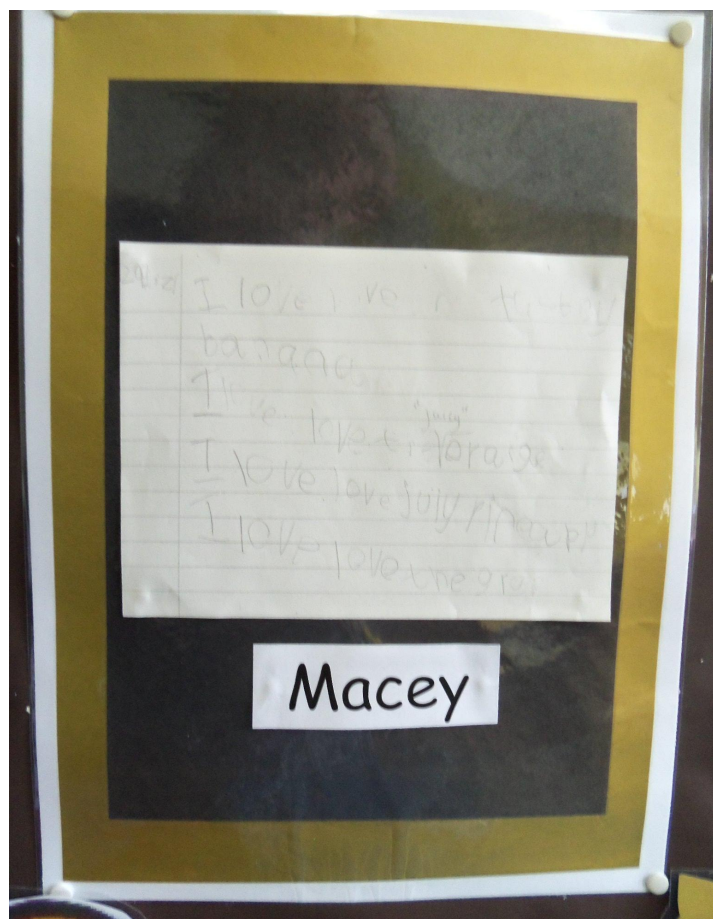


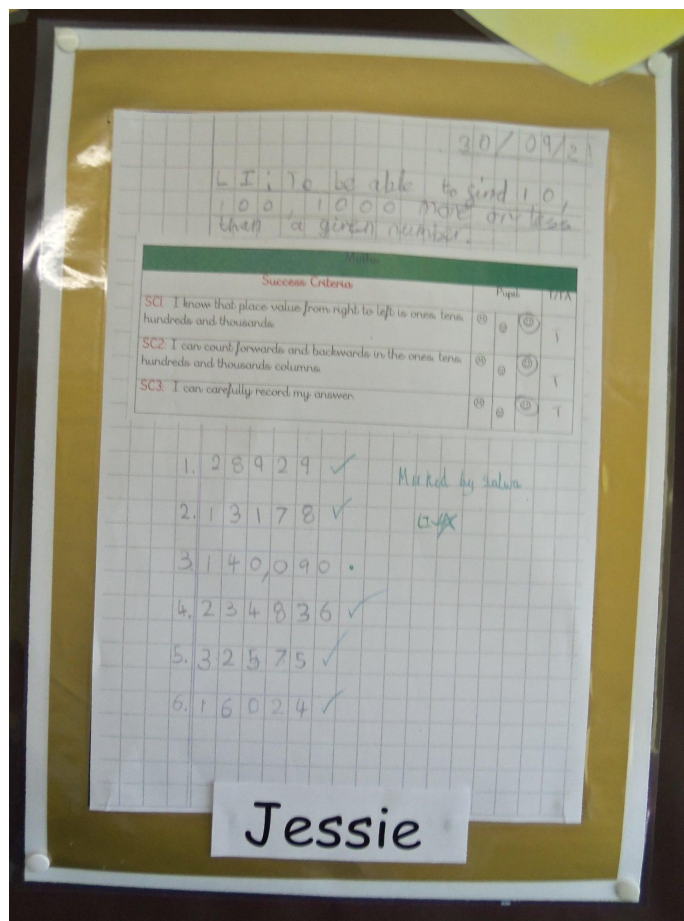
