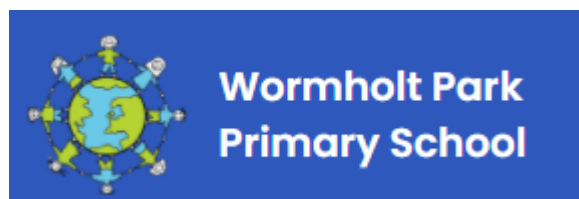

Head's Chat

I am delighted by the amount of parents who have completed the survey. We now have 55 responses, which is a record! There is still time to fill it in if you haven't managed to yet. I am also overwhelmed by the positive feedback and comments - thank you.

We are identifying areas for development from the survey and some of these can be quick fixes. For example:

- We have now added a parent/carer calendar to the Parents tab of the website (more info below) This will enable you all to know about events well in advance.
- Some parents have asked if we can run more after school clubs. We are looking into how we can do this. Our issue here is that our school budget has been cut dramatically and we can no longer pay for these ourselves. However, as most other schools do, we could run clubs if parents were willing to pay for them. For example, you could pay something like £40 in advance for a 10 week block (£4 per session). We would obviously have to make sure we had a minimum of about 12 children in each club to keep the cost down. We will send out a further survey about this in the next couple of weeks, once we have worked out all the details!
- A few parents have commented that they don't have information about what their child will be learning each year. Until we have decided how to make this more explicit, please have a look at our website, which gives lots of information.

8. Now under the sunken ship you will see gold.

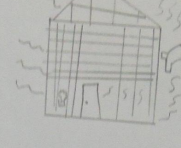

The benefits of greenhouses are sure to surprise you! So Stay Alert!



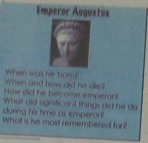
Greenhouses are a healthy and safe way to grow plants. Greenhouses give plants almost everything they need!

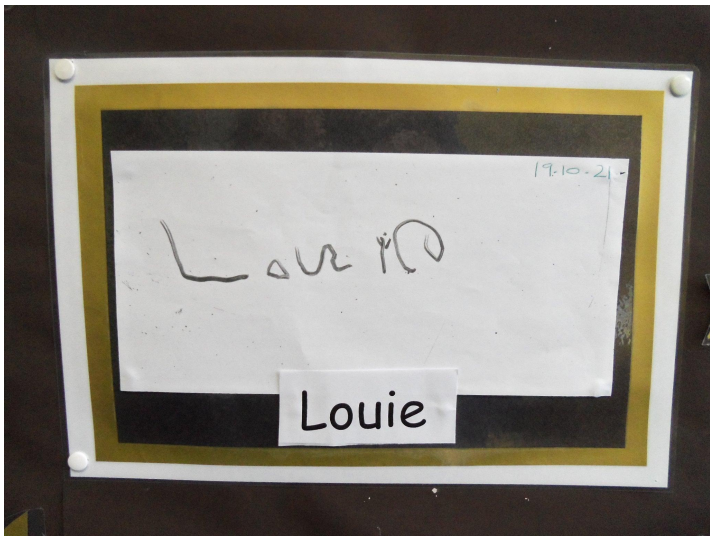

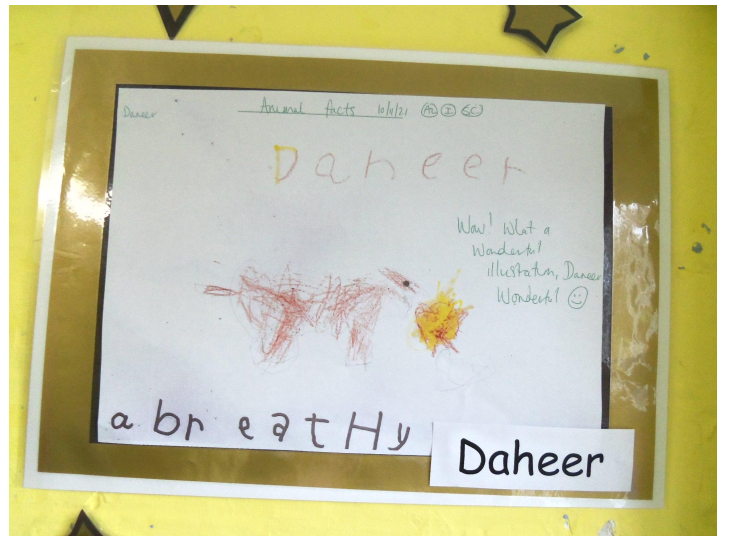
