Head's Chat

I hope you've all had a good week.

The weather is certainly getting colder, so keep wrapped up warm this weekend.

I haven't mentioned Covid-19 for a while, however, unfortunately, I need to this week.

We are aware that local rates of transmission are currently very high and a number of schools are now closing classes or more. We are asking for your help to safeguard your own families but to also avoid the transmission at Wormholt Park. We have been very lucky to date but rates are high in the area and we want to take necessary actions to contain the virus.

Look after your health and well-being

Please ensure that your children eat and sleep well. Healthy food can boost the immune system and keep them well.

High vigilance at school to avoid spread

We will be very vigilant in the coming 3 weeks, to avoid closure of classes and remote learning having to be adopted. In primary school aged children, Covid-19 can present in many different ways.

Testing when children are unwell

We encourage you to do a PCR when children display mild symptoms, like colds, sore throats, earaches, headaches and tummy aches as well as the main symptoms (coughs, temperatures and loss of taste/smell). Children with such symptoms should not attend school unless they have had a PCR test. If children arrive at school unwell, we will have to send them home.

You must let us know if your child tests positively so we can take steps to keep children and staff safe.

Lateral Flow Testing

At this very challenging time, we encourage you to consider doing a weekly 'family test' if possible.

We suggest that all members of the family might test on a Sunday evening using a lateral flow test. Lateral flow tests can be obtained from chemists.

These simple tests can be administered on children of any age and can indicate if children are asymptomatic and lessen the chance of spreading the virus. We feel this would help us manage any spread in the remainder of the term.

Let's work together to ensure we can keep the school fully open until the Christmas holidays.

Kindness Week

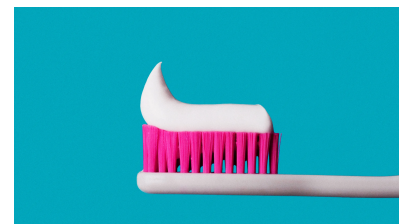


This week, we had our 'Kindness Week.' The children were encouraged to carry out at least one act of kindness each day. I hope they were kind to you!

Keep Smiling Programme

The **Keep Smiling** program is designed to improve the dental health of Nursery and Reception aged children. Applying fluoride helps protect children's teeth against tooth decay. It is endorsed by the Department of Health as good practise. Next week the CLCH Oral Health Promotion Team will be in school visiting Nursery and Reception on the morning of Thursday 2nd December and Friday 3rd December.



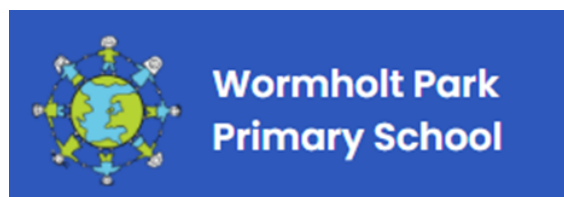
During this visit they will be delivering their Keep Smiling Programme. This is a Supervised Tooth brushing and fluoride varnish application programme.

On Day 1 (**Thursday 2nd December**): the Oral Health promoting team will be supervising the children brushing their teeth.

On Day 2 (**Friday 3rd December**): the Oral Health promoting team will apply fluoride Varnish to the children's teeth.

The CLCH Oral Health Promotion Team requires consent from parents/ guardians of those wishing their child to take part. The consent form can be reached via a link to an online electronic form, which is very easy to fill. This has been emailed to parents of children in Reception and Nursery.

If you wish your child to take part in the two day programme please complete the consent form that has been emailed out. If you haven't received one please ask a member of the staff in the office.
