

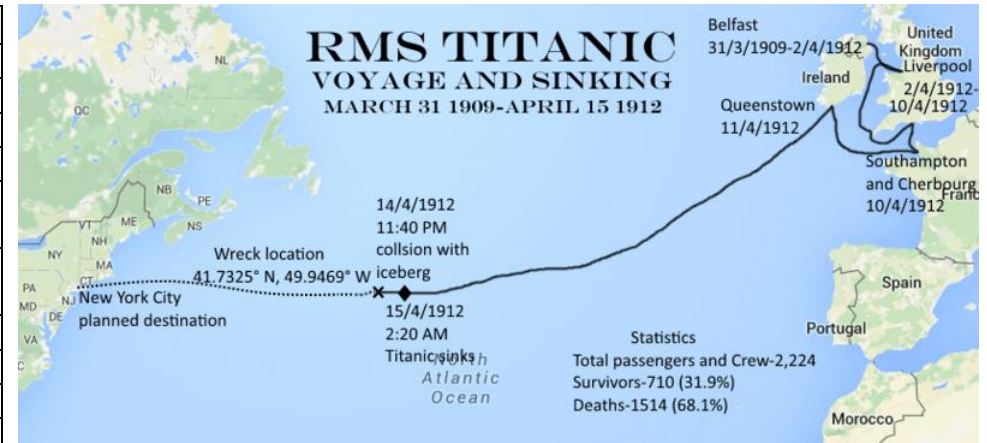

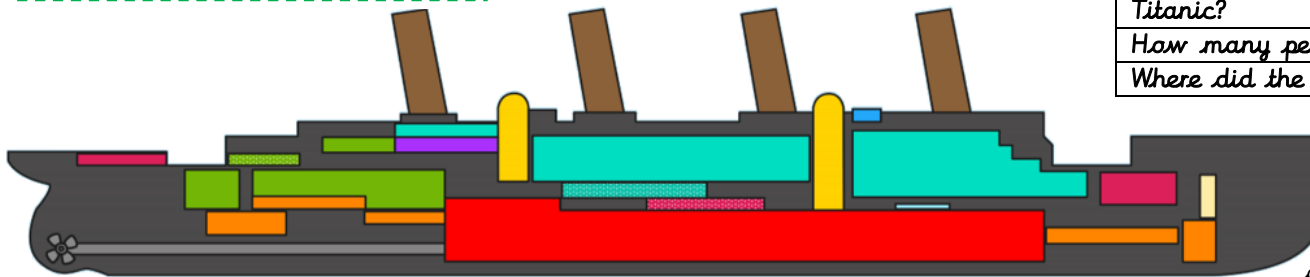















Key Vocabulary	Definitions
<i>bow</i>	The front part of a ship.

<i>vessel</i>	A large board or ship.
<i>maiden voyage</i>	The first journey made by the craft in its intended duty.
<i>facilities</i>	A place or piece of equipment provided for a particular purpose.
<i>steward</i>	A worker on a ship who attends to the needs of a passenger.
<i>distress</i>	Extreme sorrow or pain.
<i>deploy</i>	Bring into effective action.
<i>hypothermia</i>	The condition of having abnormally low body temperature.
<i>steerage</i>	A part of a ship providing the cheapest accommodation.
<i>airtight container</i>	A space which doesn't allow air to escape.
<i>opulence</i>	Having or indicating wealth.

When did the Titanic sink?	15 <sup>th</sup> April 1912
How many people died on the Titanic?	Around 1,514 (68% of the people on board)
How many people survived?	Around 710 people
Where did the Titanic sail?	Along the Atlantic Ocean
