Can I remind Year 1 parents that the children should now be coming into school on their own. You can watch your child go to the door from the gates.

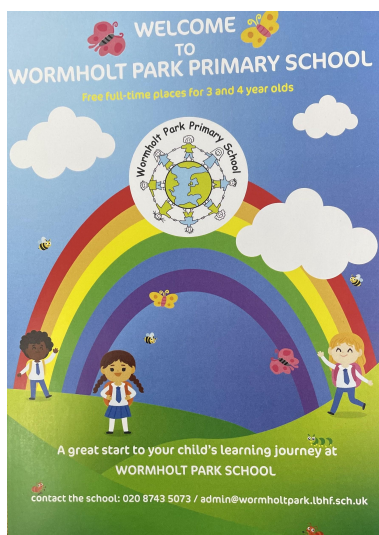
