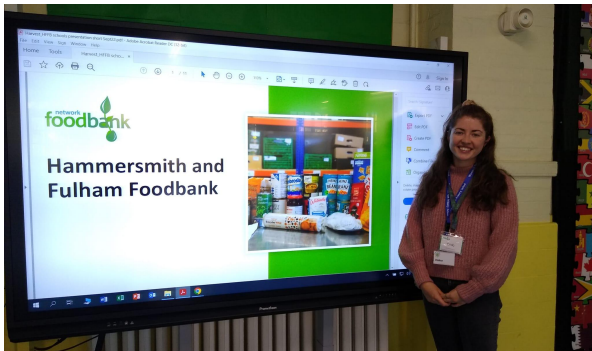

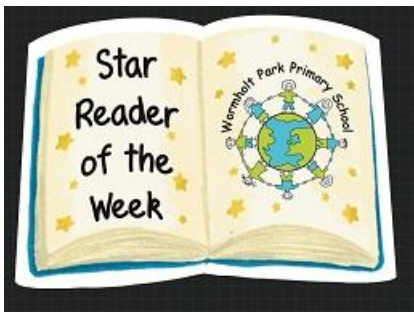
Getting Started: When do you find it easier (or more difficult) to work with others in a positive way?
