## Year 6 White Rose Bakery Project

Year 6 have spent the past 2 weeks working on a bakery project in their White Rose maths sessions. The project involved using ratio and proportion to scale up and down the recipe ingredients and it also used the 4 operations to calculate shopping bills and discounts and whether deals were actually a good deal or not. We then looked at profit and loss and how much you would have to sell a cupcake for to break even based on the cost of the ingredients and we used nets of packaging to calculate area, perimeter and volume. We finally calculated time problems using cooking scenarios and yesterday we actually made the cupcakes. Who knew that maths could taste so good!

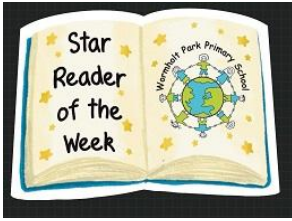
## Year 6 Stewardship
