Geography



This term our humanities focus is geography. We will be finding answers to the question 'Would you prefer to live in a hot or cold place?' Children will:

- Locate the seven continents
- Compare the climates of the UK and Kenya

Reading: Children should practise reading for at least 15 minutes every day

Times Tables:




Children in KS1 will be expected to be able to count in steps of 2s, 5s and 10s.
