History:



This half term, we have a History focus. We will be learning about the Tudors. Children will research and learn about what life was like in the Tudor times. Children will also learn about the significant people from the Tudor times and some key vocabulary that will support their learning in History. Children will:

- Extract information about significant people from the Tudor times
- Use a variety of sources to gain information and find evidence to make deductions about what life was like in the Tudor times.

English:



We will be studying character descriptions and persuasive writing.

Children will be using our Reading book, 'There's a Boy in the Girls Bathroom' to write a character description and persuasive letters. Children will develop their comprehension skills through daily guided reading sessions where they will be answering vocabulary, inference, prediction, explain, retrieval and summarise style questions linked to the chosen text.

Maths:



We will be covering the following topics this half term:

- Number: Place Value
- Number: Addition & Subtraction
- Statistics: Graphs

Children will have an arithmetic focus during skills sessions for maths throughout the week.

Science:



This half term, we will be learning about materials including mixtures and separation. Children will develop these skills through a series of lessons and experiments.

Computing:



Digital Literacy: *Internet Safety*

Pupils will be learning how to stay safe online.

Computer Science: *Scratch: Music*

Children will be learning how to programme music.

Art/DT: We will be focussing on sculpture and 3D: Interactive installation and craft and design: architecture.

Music: We will be looking at composition notation with the theme of Ancient Egypt.

RSHE: We will be learning about family and relationships and health and wellbeing.

RE: We will be focusing on Wisdom, learning about Christianity: Bible, Judaism: Torah and Sikhism: Guru Granth Sahib.

French: We will be learning about French Monster pets.

PE:



PE is on Tuesday afternoon and Wednesday afternoon. Children can come into school in their PE Kits. This half term, we will be taking part in OAA (Outdoor Adventurous Activities) and gymnastics.

Spellings:



Children will have a spelling test every Monday.

Children will be given new spellings on Monday to learn throughout the week. Spellings will also be posted on Google classroom with fun activities to support learning.

Children should learn their spellings each week using: Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check

Reading:

Children should read for at least 15 minutes every day.

Times Tables:



Children should practice their timetables every day.

They will have a timetables challenge every Wednesday. This challenge will include all times tables up to 12.

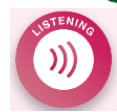


Our poem this half term is: *Pleasant Sounds* by John Clare
