Geography

This term our humanities focus is geography. We will be finding answers to the question 'Why does population change?' Children will:

- Identify what migration is and consider push and pull factors.
- Look at population trends over time and consider reasons for these changes.

English:

We will be learning about Henry VIII and the Tudor period while we finish our non-chronological report and complete a piece of independent writing for SATs assessment. We will then move on to look at the expedition of Ernest Shackleton and use that experience to write informal letters based on the real-life expedition members. We will focus on using informal tone and remaining in character.

Maths:

We will be covering the following topics this half term:

- Short division
- Long division
- All of fractions
- Consolidating all of our operations knowledge
- Percentages

There will also be an 8.00 maths club once a week for pupils to practise their arithmetic skills. We would like all pupils to attend.

Science:



This half term, we will be studying Light. We will be looking at and classifying sources of light and examining the concept of luminosity. We will carry out experiments to identify transparent, translucent and opaque objects. We will also examine the concepts of refraction and reflection and study scientists who have made breakthroughs in the field of Light.

Computing:

Computing systems and networks

- Pupils will discover the history of Bletchley Park and learn about code breaking and password hacking.
- They will demonstrate digital literacy skills by creating presentations.

Art/DT:	We will be focusing on creating waistcoats using textiles.
Music:	We will be looking at a catch-up unit involving the history of the Blues.
RHE:	We will be focusing on the importance of respect.
RE:	We will be studying the Buddhist concept of suffering (Dukkha)

PE:

PE is on <u>Wednesday afternoon</u> and <u>Thursday afternoon</u>. Children should come to school wearing their PE kits. This half term, Santiago will be doing gymnastics and rugby.

Spellings:



Our spelling focuses this half term are:

- Words ending in -able
- Words ending in -ably
- Word families based on common meanings

- Children should learn their spellings each week using: Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check.

Children will have a spelling test on <u>Tuesday.</u>
