Universal Free School Meals programme – it's extending until the middle of 2025!

The Mayor of London, Sadiq Khan, has announced that he is extending funding for Universal Free School Meals for another academic school year between September 2024 and July 2025. This means that primary school aged children who attend a state funded school in London will continue to receive a healthy, nutritious meal for free.

Even though your child is receiving their free school meals automatically, it is still vitally important – if you have not done so already – to complete your school or borough's short registration form in case your child is eligible for extra funding for their school from the Government, worth over £1,300 per year. That's more money for extracurricular activities, teacher

development and support for children who need it most. This will ensure you'll also receive any other benefits you may be entitled to, like food vouchers during the holidays. Ask your school for more info or visit your borough website.

We had to design and market a service that could be accessed such as a cinema (which we called The Big Screen!) and hairdressers (Which we had branded as The Hair Experts!)


We had great fun throughout the week and focused on three main skills which were Leadership, Staying Positive and Aiming High.


Book: The Coin Quest By George Badejo-Adegbenga




