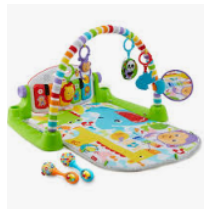

Mystery Readers Wanted!



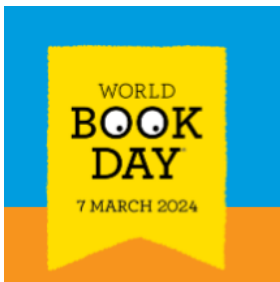
WHO?

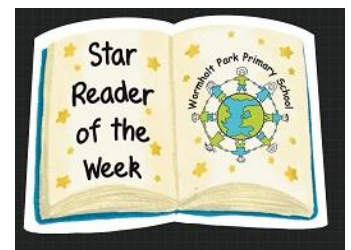
To get started, each child has received a map and a family pack which contains two cards, one for a child and one for a parent/carer, register these on the website <https://www.beatthestreet.me/hf/>
