Geography: Why do oceans matter?



This half term we have a Geography focus. Children will be finding out about why the ocean is important to us and explore the different reasons they matter. Children will

- Describe how the ocean is used for human activity.
- Explain how the ocean helps to regulate the Earth's climate and temperature.
- Identify the Great Barrier Reef as part of Australia.
- Describe the benefits of the Great Barrier Reef.
- Describe how humans impact the oceans and the consequences of this.

English:



Children will be using our core text book to write narratives. We will write persuasive texts and a speech.

Children will develop their comprehension skills using VIPERS through daily guided reading sessions.

The grammar concepts covered this half term include: active and passive voice, modal verbs, prefixes and suffixes. Children will also practise using commas, hyphens, brackets, dashes, semi-colons, colons or dashes and parentheses.

Maths:



We will be covering the following topics this term:

- Multiplication and division
- Fractions
- Numbers - decimals and percentages

Every Tuesday, children will have an arithmetic focus for maths.

Science:



This half term, we will be learning about living things. Children will have a focus on life cycles and reproductions. Children will use a variety of enquiry types to research and learn about living things.

Computing:



Children will be working on search engines. Children will

- Explain what a search engine is, suggesting several search engines to use and explain how to use them to find websites and information.
- Suggest that things online aren't always true and recognise what to check for.
- Explain why keywords are important and what TASK stands for, using these strategies to search effectively.

Art/DT: DT - Mechanical systems, making a pop-up book

Music: Blues

RSHE: Economic wellbeing

RE: Justice: Christianity, Islam, and Buddhism

French: French speaking world

PE:



PE is on Tuesday afternoon and Wednesday afternoon. This half term, we will be learning how to play hockey and dance.

Spellings:



Children will have a spelling test every Monday.

Spellings for each week will be handed out to take home to practice with a handwriting sheet to support practice at home.

Children should learn their spellings each week using: Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check

Reading:

Children should read for at least 15 minutes every day.

Times Tables:



Children should practice their timetables every day.

They will have a timetables test every Monday. This will be a timed test on all times tables in random orders.

Core Text:



Our core text this half term is *Varmints* by Helen Ward and Marc Craste. Children will have the opportunity to explore this novel through reading, writing and role play.

Our language of the half term is Albanian. Our Albanian community represents 2.8% of our families at Wormholt.
