The children took part in a wide range of races and I was really impressed with how they supported each other throughout the events. What I think stood out for me the most, was how much the children's stamina has improved. Last September, we introduced 'The Daily Mile' and since then, the children have been running up to a mile every day in the playground. 


- what the different type of Secondary School options are;

Getting Started: How can you find out about how others are feeling about something?


Intermediate: How can you find out more about strengths and weaknesses in others?
