"The caterpillar turns into a butterfly. He stays inside the cocoon for two weeks" - Destiny

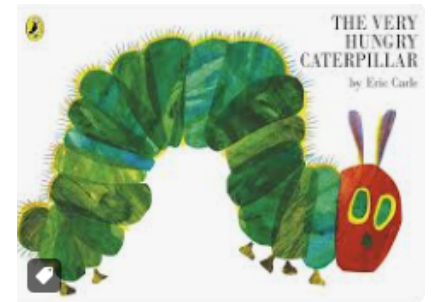
"I love rainbow butterflies" - Ayat

"The caterpillar ate too much and got sick" - Guber

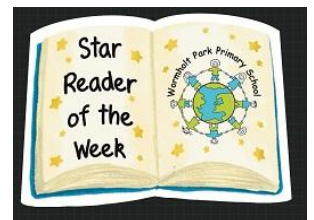
"My favourite part of this book is when he turns into a butterfly" - Jack


