## Class Assemblies

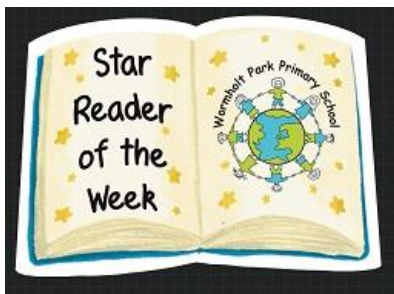

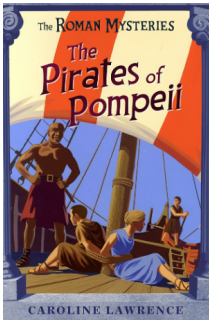
