
One Piece by Eiichiro Oda

Captain Underpants by Dan Pilkey



Right Respecting - Article of the Week

The UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) is an important, legally binding agreement signed by 196 countries which outlines the fundamental rights of every child, regardless of their race, religion or abilities.



The Convention has 54 articles that cover all aspects of a child's life and set out the civil, political, economic, social and cultural rights. The convention is universal—these rights apply to **every** child and the convention entitles every child to claim them. It also explains how adults and governments must work together to make sure all children can enjoy all their rights.

At Wormholt Park, these 54 articles are firmly embedded in our school ethos and practice. This year, we have decided to look more closely at each of the articles one by one. Each week we will be learning about and celebrating an Article of the Week. This week we will be looking at **Article 29**

I have the right to an education which develops my personality, talents and abilities.


