#### We are now an Opal School!

I wonder if your child has come home and told you about our fantastic new playground? We have signed up to an initiative called Opal (Outdoor Play and Learning).

What is Opal? It is a project that supports high quality play for all children. Before the holidays, many of you completed a survey we sent out about play. It was so wonderful to see how much you all value play.

#### Research shows that:

- The average screen time per day can be up to six hours.
- The average outdoor play time per week is five hours.
- The percentage of UK children who only play outdoors with other children at school is 56%.

There are many proven benefits for schools that carry out the OPAL Primary Programme. They usually include: more enjoyment of school, less teaching time lost to disputes between children, fewer accidents and greatly improved behaviour.

Play is not messing about. It is the process evolution has come up with to enable children to learn all of the things that cannot be taught, while also having so much fun. There are certain things children must have in order to be able to play. These include:

- Having clothes that they can play in.
- Having things to play with.
- Having a certain amount of freedom.

What we want to offer is 'Amazing play, everyday, for every child'

We launched Opal on Wednesday and it has been a huge success! Please ask your child about what they have done at playtime this week.

You will notice that children are allowed to play in our mud kitchen and climb trees (safely!). Your child may come home a bit dirty but this is a fantastic sign that they have played brilliantly, so please don't worry.

We would love all children to bring a coat every day and have a spare change of clothes at school in case they get wet/muddy. If you are able to, please send in a bag with a change of clothes - not uniform) Also, if anyone has old coats or wellie boots at home, please can you bring them in. If you have any deliveries at home, we would love the empty boxes. Over the last three days, the children have really enjoyed making fantastic things out of cardboard.

If you are a working parent on Universal Credit, you can claim up to 85% of this cost back through your Universal Credit. Please click on the link below for details:


