History:



This half term we have a Stone, Bronze and Iron Age focus. We will be learning about early settlements, trade and learning the role of an Archaeologist. Children will:

- Investigating the rise of Pre-Historic man
- Learn about the role of an Archaeologist and how this supports our historical understanding
- Compare and contrast early settlements in the Stone, Bronze and Iron age

English:



We will be studying how to write a diary entry.

Children will learn the key structure and features of a diary entry. This will be done using the writing process: cold write, modelled write, shared write and an independent write

Children will be able to published a well-structured and include key features of a diary entry by the end of this half term.

We will be covering the following topics for this half term:

Science:



This half-term, we will be learning about the human skeleton, children will identify key bones and explore how muscle changes result in movement. They learn about how the body uses energy, what constitutes a balanced diet in humans and how research contributes to nutritionist expertise.

This half term we will be understanding the concept of networks, learning how devices communicate. From identifying components, learn how information is shared and deepen this understanding by exploring examples of real-world networks.

By the end of Year 3, children are expected to know the x2, x3, x4, x5, x6, x8, x10 timetables.

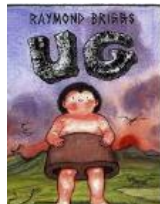
Children should practice their timetables every day.
