• <u>Article 4 (implementation of the Convention)</u>


Governments must do all they can to make sure every child can enjoy their rights by creating systems and passing laws that promote and protect children's rights.

Weekly Book Review

This week we have a book review from Manila Class

In Nursery we have been reading Goldilocks and the Three Bears. The children have learned important lessons about respecting others' belongings, understanding different preferences, and recognizing that actions have consequences. They also explored basic math concepts like big, small, and medium, as

seen in the sizes of the porridge bowls, chairs, and beds. The story encourages curiosity while teaching the importance of boundaries and consideration for others. Through its repetitive structure, children practice listening and memory skills, and develop empathy by relating to Goldilocks' experience. Overall, it's a fun and engaging way to reinforce both social and early math concepts for young learners.

We have really enjoyed reading this story. These are some of things that the children have said about this story:

"Goldilocks likes porridges"

"She only likes the small ones"


"The three bears are angry at Goldilocks"
