Our Nursery- We have spaces!!



If your child is 2 years old, please pop into the office and register them for Nursery. **Most of our children start as soon as they are 3!**

We can offer part-time places or full-time if you have the 30 hour code.

We would be very happy to show you around if you'd like.

Arbor - parent log in - we now have 66% of parents signed up! We want to get to 100% asap so please follow the instructions below....



You will have recently received details to set up your Arbor Parent Portal account. Using Arbor allows us to communicate with you more efficiently, and will enable you to access a wider range of information about your child's school life, via the Arbor Parent Portal and the downloadable Parent App.

The Parent Portal and Parent App will let you see your child's registration data and their attendance. You will be able to register your child for trips and clubs and make payments; all from one portal on your phone or computer. If you have downloaded the App and allowed notifications, we will also be able to send in-app messages directly to your phone.

How do I log in to the new system?

To set up a login for your account on the new system, you just need to set a password. Your username is the email address we've sent the 'Welcome to Arbor at Wormholt Park School!' to. The Arbor Parent App can be downloaded from either the Playstore on android phones or the Apple Store on iPhones.

Pupil Data

Once you have logged in, you will be able to see all the basic pupil data for your child(ren), such as guardian contact details, consents and attendance data, by clicking 'View Student Profile'.

If you see any data which you think is incorrect, there is the option to request that we change this, by clicking on the grey arrows next to the data; this sends a request to the school to update the data.

Payments

The option to make payments via Arbor will be activated once you set up your account, we will cease using SchoolComms at the end of this month.

Thank you for your support with this change, which we hope will have a positive impact on your experience of communicating with the school.



Breakfast Club



Please remember that if you would like your child to attend breakfast club, they must be registered first. Just pop into the office and fill in a quick form. You will be able to add any important information like food allergies on this form too.

After School Wraparound Care


Please remember that we now have after school wraparound care until 5.45pm daily.

The children who attend this provision love it! They play, read, relax and have fun! If you need after school care for your child, please have a chat with Joanna in the office and she will help you. Your child doesn't have to come every day. They can come for as many days as you need. The cost is £12 per child per day. If you are on Universal Credit, you may be able to claim back up to 85% of the cost. https://www.gov.uk/guidance/universal-credit-childcare-costs






Opal Playground

This week, we are asking for any donations of scooters. If you have any you are no longer using, please bring them to the office. Thank you for your continued support.


Skills Builder Weekly Challenge
