# Humanities: Geography



This term our humanities focus is Geography. We will be finding answers to the question 'Why is our world wonderful?' Children will:

- · identify human and physical features
- name and locate the 5 oceans on a world map
- use an aerial photo to draw a simple sketch map

# English:



We will be writing narratives inspired by Traditional Tales. We will be sharing the story The Very Jolly Postman by Allan & Janet Ahlberg.

Children will develop their comprehension skills through daily guided reading sessions when they will be answering retrieval, inference and word meaning questions.

#### Maths:



We will be covering the following topics this half term:

- length and height
- mass, capacity and temperature

#### Science:



Our science topic this half term is: Animals: Life Cycles and Health Children will:

- learn that animals, including humans, have offspring which grow into adults
- understand why humans exercise, eat different types of food, and keep clean.

#### PE:



PE is on Wednesday and Thursday. Children should wear their P.E. kits to school. Please refer to the school website for quidance on the expected P.E. kit. Some lessons will take place outside so suitable footwear needs to be worn. If your child's shoes have laces, please practise tying these at home. Our focus for P.E. lessons this term will be Dance and Netball.

# Spellings:



Children should learn their spellings each week using: Look, Say Cover, Write Check

Children will have a spelling test every Monday.

Spellings will be sent home on a Tuesday and can also be found on Google classroom.

#### Reading:

Children should practise reading for at least 15 minutes every day. Reading books are changed every Tuesday.

### Times Tables:



Children in KS1 will be expected to be able to count in steps of 2s, 5s and 10s. By the end of KS1 your child will begin to link counting in steps to times tables. You can support this by practising counting in steps and by practising these times tables.

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
