Geography: Where does our energy come from?

This half term, our geography focus is where does our energy come from?

In this unit, children will:

- Describe the significance of energy,
- Define renewable and non-renewable energy,
- Identify human features of geography on a digital map,

English:

We will be studying newspaper reports. Pupils will write entertaining and engaging reports using our core reading text as a stimulus. Children will continue to develop their comprehension skills through daily guided reading sessions, using VIPERS skills such as retrieval, inference and word meaning to demonstrate their understanding of a range of texts. The grammar concepts covered this half term include parenthesis, relative clauses, conjunctions and modal verbs. Pupils will also employ a range of punctuation such as dashes and semi-colons to demarcate their writing and give it structure.

Science:



This half term, we will have a biology focus and will be studying animals and plants. They will look at how to classify animals and plants based on specific characteristics. They will describe the differences in the life cycles of mammals, amphibians, insects and birds and they will identify the main parts of a plant and describe their functions.

- Describe the significance of the prime meridian,
- Locate UK cities on a map,
- Consider and justify the location of energy sources.



We will be covering the following topics this half term:

- recapping arithmetic from the Autumn term.
- ratio and proportion
- measurement
- geometry property of shape
- geometry position and direction
- statistics

Every <u>Wednesday</u>, children will have an arithmetic focus for maths.

Computing:

Creating Media: The History of Computers

- Pupils will produce a simple radio play with some special sound effects and simple edits, which demonstrate understanding of how to use the software.
- Pupils will demonstrate a clear understanding of personal devices, and how they affected modern computers.

Art/DT:	We will be carrying out a textiles unit on making cushions.
Music:	We will be continuing our Delia Derbyshire Melody Composition.
RSHE:	We will be focusing this half term on Economic Wellbeing.
RE:	We will be learning about the concept of 'Sacrifice' in Christianity.
French:	We will be continuing to look at colours and my family.

PE:

PE is on Tuesday afternoon and Wednesday afternoon. Children should come to school in their PE kits.

This half term, Seoul will be doing gymnastics and street hockey.

Spellings:



Our spelling focuses this half term are:

- Words with endings which sound like/shuhl/ after a vowel letter,
- Words with endings which sound like /shuhl/ after a consonant letter,
- Words with a 'soft c' spelt /ce/,
- Word families based on common words showing how words are related in form and meaning.

Children should learn their spellings each week using: Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check

Children will have a spelling test on <u>Tuesday</u>. Spellings for the Spring term are posted on Google Classroom.
