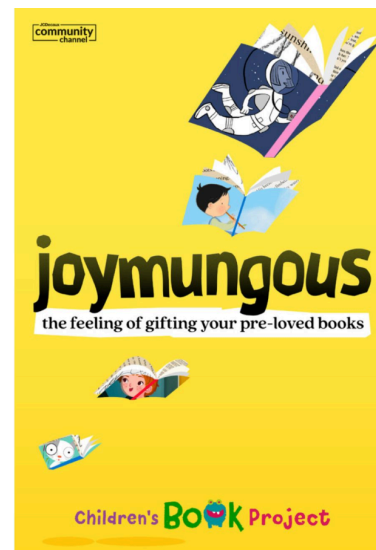

Mastery: What is an 'unhelpful conflict'? How can you avoid this when working with others?

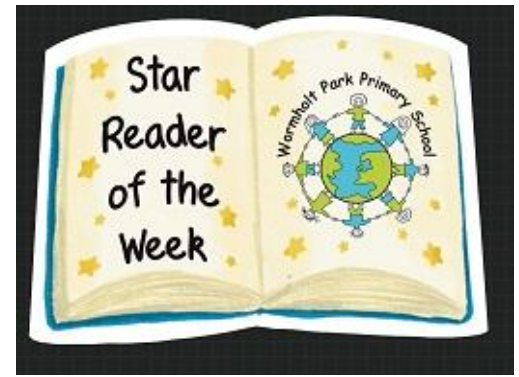

This week, the Star Readers of the Week are Ishaq from Lima (Y2) and Zain from Athens Class (Y4). Well Done both of you!



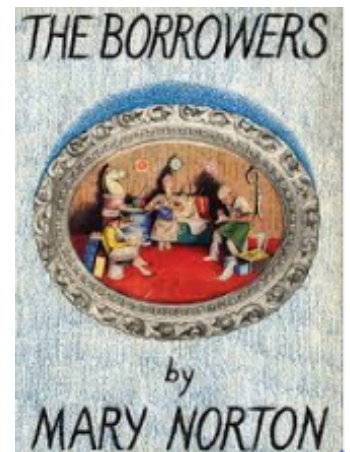
Weekly Book Review

This term, our staff will be writing reviews of books they enjoyed reading. This week we have a book review from Mrs Trimm, from our Reception class.

Book Review: *The Borrowers* written by Mary Norton

The Borrowers is a story book that I really enjoyed as a child, passed on to me from one of my older sisters. It frequently comes to mind as one that shaped my relationship with reading from a young age, setting me off in good stead with a solid foundational understanding and regard for the world of "imagination".

It is a story of a tiny family of miniature people, the Clock family, who live secretly in the house of a normal sized family. These tiny beings are known as 'Borrowers' as they live by "borrowing" items from the house they inhabit in order to survive. The story by Mary Norton has been described as being a wonderfully traditional fairy tale, a skilled and mindful critique of society and an exemplary exploration of the complexities of human relationships, our fears of the unknown, and the differences between 'wants' and 'needs'.



But for me, as a child the magic of the story was much simpler. The magic was in the ways that it inspired my imagination, how it fed the childlike wonderment we nurture in children today; how it allowed for me to imagine how well a matchbox might make for a miniature wardrobe, or a bottle top a kitchen table - how I could imagine a pocket-sized best friend whom I'd discovered under the floorboards who could travel through many an adventure with me.

As an adult I appreciate immensely the imagination of the author, to make magic of the ordinary and so heartily envisage how someone so different from ourselves might use the 'ordinary' to make 'extraordinary'.

The Borrowers is an excellent story, full of important messages, endearing and artful relationships and magic to create. I truly believe that it is timeless, I couldn't recommend it enough.
