Opal Playground


This week, we are asking for any donations of crayons, felt tip pens and chalk. If you have any, please bring them to the office. Thank you for your continued support.

If your child is 2 years old, please pop into the office for a Nursery Application form.


If your child is already 3 - please speak to Kim (in the office) and we can get them started asap!

This week we have three book reviews from children in Santiago Class (Y6)


Book: Alex Rider (Volume 9) by Anthony Horowitz

I liked that Polly and Digory quickly became friends and they got to know each other at the beginning of the summer holidays.


Would you recommend this book?
