After a few delays, the Wormholt Wanderers finally had their final league match of the season against Kenmont Primary School and it was an electric afternoon of grassroots football! We had multiple shots on goal. 

This week, the Star Readers of the Week are Maria from La Paz (Y2) and Yassin from Seoul Class (Y6). Well Done both of you!


Weekly Book Review
