It means that our school is committed to teaching children about the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC). These are the basic rights all children have – such as the right to be safe, to learn, to be healthy, to have a voice, and to be treated fairly. By learning about their own rights and the rights of others, children grow in confidence, kindness, and respect.

Our school is a place where every child feels valued, listened to, and empowered to make a difference – both in school and beyond. We have seen how this approach is helping children to understand the importance of fairness, inclusion, and respect for others. It's also helping them to become more thoughtful, responsible, and active citizens.

Please speak to your child about their rights and the rights of others. You will be amazed at how much they know!

Please come and join us at playtime on **Wednesday 21st May from 10.30am to 11.00am.** It's great fun and we would love to see you there!


Our Nursery- We still have spaces!!

Have you been completing any of these skills builder challenges at home?



Book Review: Varjak Paw by SF Said

Year 4 have been on an unforgettable journey with Varjak Paw by SF Said. The story follows Varjak, a young Mesopotamian Blue cat, as he leaves the safety of his home and ventures into a world full of danger, challenges and unexpected lessons. Along the way, he learns ancient skills, makes unlikely friendships and begins to understand who he truly is.



From the very first chapter, the pupils were completely hooked. They responded with real curiosity and empathy, often sharing predictions, favourite scenes and even frustrations with some of the characters. Our classroom was regularly buzzing with conversation about courage, independence and what it means to grow.

The book also inspired some fantastic writing. We used key events from the story as the basis for newspaper articles, helping pupils develop their skills while staying connected to the characters and plot. It was brilliant to see their ideas come to life on the page.


