History:



This half term we are finding out about the Stone, Bronze and Iron Age. We will be learning about early settlements, trade and learning the role of an Archaeologist. Children will:

- Investigating the rise of Pre-Historic man
- Learn about the role of an Archaeologist and how this supports our historical understanding
- Compare and contrast early settlements in the Stone, Bronze and Iron age

English:

We will be learning how to write a diary entry.
