Theme: Seasons



This half term our theme is: Seasons.

We will be looking at the changing season and exploring our wider environment.

We will continue to learn about ourselves through songs, creative arts and stories.

Literacy:



This term we will be reading:

- We're going on a Bear hunt by Micheal Rosen
- Stick Man by Julia Donaldson

These books will focus on exploring our wider environment. These books have repeated phrases that the children will learn, building on their listening skills. We will also be learning a weekly poem from 'Poetry Basket': Wise Old Owl

Phonics:



In Nursery, we are continuing to focus on Phase 1 in Phonics.

This includes;

- Listening to sounds in our environment.
- Tuning to a story
- Exploring instrumental sounds
- Joining with nursery rhymes

Maths:



This half term we will continuing to focus on:

- Begin to order number names 1,2,3
- Subitise to 3 - I can see 2 cats. I can see 3 dogs. Can you see 2 mice?
- Recognise 1,2,3 in well-known tales e.g Three Billy Goats Gruff, Three Little Pigs
- Responds to simple language of position such as 'in', 'out', 'on', 'under', 'over' and 'behind
- Informal language to describe shapes, such as 'sharp', 'pointy', 'round', 'curvy' and 'flat

Physical Development (PD):



Our focus this term continues to be:

- Putting on coats on with support.
- Social skills games.
- Listening to skills to follow instructions.
- Using our bodies to make different movements: crawling, hopping, rolling, and stretching.
- Moving our bodies to music by dancing, clapping and stamping.

Understanding the World (UW):



This half-term, the children will be exploring and getting to know their wider environment using all their senses.

We will explore the park and our allotment using our senses: smell, touch, sight and listening.

We will begin to look at the weather, seasons and how it changes the environment around us.

Other Areas of Learning



Communication and Language:

We will be working on our listening skills by taking part in daily routines, story time and singing.

Children will have opportunities to show their interests by accessing the continuous provision (all of the activities set up daily in Nursery).

The environment will allow them to work on their focus and attention. Interaction with others will nurture their speaking and language.

Home Learning:



We encourage our parents to read to their child for at least 10 minutes every day. We will give you a storybook to read to your child each week. Please return this book to be changed on **Fridays**.

16% of our families speak Somali.

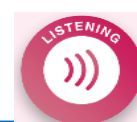
Poem of the Half Term:
