Let's Go Zero Pledge



We've taken the Let's Go Zero pledge, declaring our aim to become zero carbon by 2030. We're joining other schools across the UK in this national campaign to show our overwhelming support and we are inviting government and local councils to work with us to reach this goal.

We know that schools can be the trailblazers for their community, responding to young people's calls for action. In fact, we can inspire whole communities to tackle the climate crisis. In the coming pivotal 'climate decade,' we will be part of Let's Go

Zero's national network of schools and sustainability, sharing information about how to reach zero carbon, and working with local councils and government to make it happen.



Miss Relton's Book Review

Incredible you

Incredible You is one of those picture books that makes you smile from the very first page. It's bright, fun, and full of energy—but what I love most is the message at its heart: you are already enough, just as you are.


As a teacher, I'm always looking for books that help children feel confident and proud of who they are. This book does exactly that in a way that's simple, positive, and easy for young children to understand. The rhyming text is playful and catchy, which makes it perfect for reading aloud, and the illustrations are bursting with colour and personality—there's always something for the children to spot or giggle at!

What really stood out to me was how inclusive and uplifting it felt. It celebrates all the little things that make us unique—whether you're quiet or loud, sporty or creative—and encourages kindness, curiosity, and self-belief. After reading it with my Year 1 class, the room felt lighter. The children were beaming, and it sparked some brilliant conversations about what makes each of them "incredible."

This book is now a firm favourite in our classroom, and I think it belongs in every school library. It's perfect for story time, or just as a little boost on a rainy day.

Just a reminder for all children to bring a coat every day and have a spare change of clothes at school in case they get wet/muddy.




We would also be grateful for some donations for our Opal Playground . If you have any of the following items that you are no longer using and would be happy to donate to the school, please bring them into the Office;
