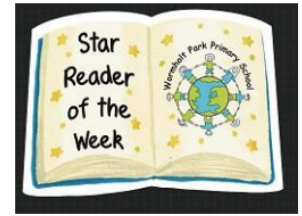
Article 27: I have the right to have a proper home, food and clothing

This week, the Star Readers of the week are Carter Havana Class (Y1) and Ayoub from Santiago Class (Y6). Well done children!

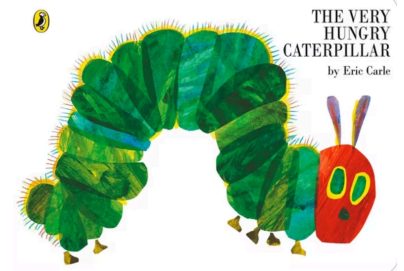


Class Book Review

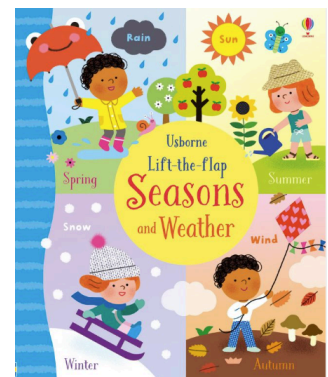
Book: Seasons by Hollie Bathie

This sensory play made it more enjoyable for the children to sit, listen, and learn together.

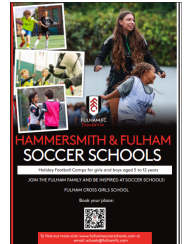


Easter Holiday Events for children in H&F

Opal Playground

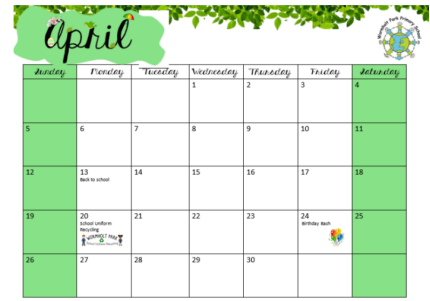
Just a reminder for all children to bring a coat every day and have a spare change of clothes at school in case they get wet/muddy.
