Topic: Growth



The topic this term is Growth. The children will be learning about what animals and plants need to grow and live. We will be looking at the life cycle of a bee, bean and other living things. The children will be keeping a diary about the changes they are seeing. They will plant seeds in our playground and care for them.

Literacy



- We will be learning about:
- Non-fiction texts
 - Labels
 - Lists
 - Instructions
 - Fact Files

The children will be exploring the difference between fiction and non-fiction text. They will also be reading seed packets and finding out how to look after their plants.

Phonics



This half term we will be continuing to work on Phase 4 which continues to build on the previous phases.

During Phase 4, adjacent consonants are taught e.g. fr(frog), dr(drip), nd(mend) as well as CCCVCC and -ed/-er/-est. These are introduced alongside the phase 2 and 3 sounds already taught in order to extend your child's vocabulary.

- E.g.
- Bench, splash, truth, string, train, green, fright,
 - float, broom, crook, clown, spoil, burnt, stairs,
 - picture, flower, stork, vent, jinx, better, mended,
 - toasted, swooped, stacked, camped, ripped, pointed
