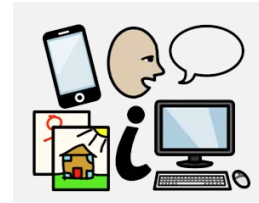

## Free half-term Art workshops for children aged 8 to 12 years

- **Thursday 28 May** – 3D Bamboo Structures: Build sculptural forms while exploring structure, balance and design.
- **Friday 29 May** – Illustration & Mark Making: Develop drawing techniques and expressive mark-making to create a personal visual language.


