Sam Lord will support you and your child with choice and advice sessions regarding Secondary School options in Hammersmith and Fulham. The Session on **Wednesday 9th September 2026** will guide you through :

- what the different type of Secondary School options are;
- how to understand the school's admissions criteria;
- what banding tests will mean to parents and their children;
- what specialist (aptitude) places are available in certain schools;
- what foundation (SIF) places will mean for you and your child;
- the process of how to apply online;
- why it is important to choose your six places, as well as timelines and open days of visits to Secondary Schools.

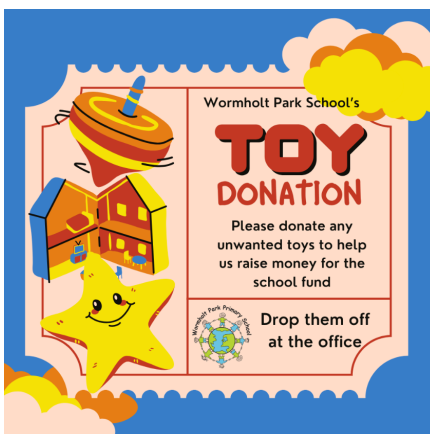
There will be a Q&A at the end to address any further queries or concerns. Save the Date!

## Class Book Review

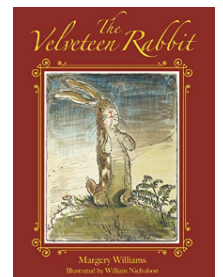
This week, we have a book review from Miss Mohamoud, Wellington Class (Year 3)


