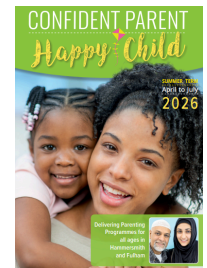
H&F May half-term holiday fun and activities

Readers of the Week

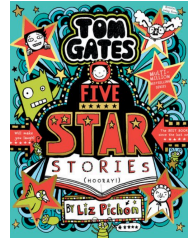
This week, the Star Readers of the week are Aseel from Lima Class (Y2) and Abdirahman from Athens class (Y4). Well done children!
